What about us?: Investigating the impacts of police brutality on Black women

In a cross-sectional survey, Black women reported their mental and physical health, PBE, and racial centrality. We found that police brutality exposure is negatively related to sleep and positively related to symptoms of depression, anxiety, and post-traumatic stress disorder. However, racial centrality moderated this relationship. Participants who were lower in racial centrality reported worse mental health and sleep outcomes than participants who were higher in racial centrality.
